The organization has -has been self-sufficient and run with little to no 17

help or support from the village. 18 19 George Marcus, the previous municipal manager, always specified we could only have one 20

representative on behalf of the NLYA speak to him.

22 We were not to go to council as he was your

representative. Every contract period Marcus 23

24 would renew our contract. Every contract was

always expired. Our previous contract was finally

renewed four months after it was expired.

always stated things were busy and he would get

with us before the season started. This was a

precedent that was set by him, your 4

5 representative.

6 In November of 2018 I e-mailed Marcus

7 asking him when we would meet to renew our

8 contract with no reply. So in December of 2018,

9 and in January of 2019, I asked Marcus after

10 village meetings when we were looking to renew the

11 contract. He would always reply with we are

looking at February. 12

13 One of our board members was present the last time I spoke with him and he stated 14 15 you'll be renewing the contract in February and it

will be with Glena. It had not been confirmed --16

confirmed yet that Glena was taking over his 17

position and he saw the questionable look on my 18

19 face. He said don't worry, we know you guys

20 aren't going anywhere.

21 We, the NLYA, continue to go about

22 our business and our planning for the upcoming

23 season. On Wednesday, January 9th, Glena came to 24 our NLYA board meeting. We asked her if she had

any questions or anything to say and she said no. 25

She was just there to listen, which we appreciated 1

you coming to. On January 25th, Marcus sent me an

e-mail stating, good morning, Shannon, we plan to

I replied again, I understand you are trying to tie up loose ends, with the e-mail you sent stating securing the building since you are currently out of contract, we don't know how to take that as a board. The way we read it is, since we're out of contract, the building will be secured and we will not have access. Need to know if we are going to have access.

No reply. So we, the board, assume 16 because this is what we do every contract period, we just wait. We the board assumed he was just 17 done with everything and we would deal with Glena. Glena e-mailed me on February 5th requesting 19 20 information in order to start working on the 21 contract.

22 We complied and we were just waiting to go hear back. On Thursday, February 7th, we 23 had three carloads worth of \$5,000 worth of candy 24 bars to drop off to the concession stand for our

spring fund-raiser. Upon arrival there was a

padlock on the concession door. I immediately went to the village office to find out what was going on. Glena wouldn't see me and I -- said I 4 needed to make an appointment. Sandy wasn't in to 6 schedule an appointment. I left a message with 7 Tammy, asking for Glena to call me immediately. 8 I also sent Glena an e-mail regarding 9 the situation. Glena did not e-mail, text nor call me back that night. Glena did, however, 10 11 return my husband's phone call, discussing the situation with him. Glena expressed to my husband 12 13 that it sounded like Marcus was not forthcoming 14 with conversations he had with me and what he was 15 telling council. 16 I got to take a breath. Glena also assured my husband that the contract looked pretty 17 18

straightforward and she saw only a few areas where she wanted to change the wording. She also stated she was getting in touch with Brookville to see what type of contract they had to compare. Through e-mail correspondence with

23 Glena the next day, I expressed that we needed 24 access to concession for storage, access to our gator that we needed to take and get repaired in 25

1 order for us to work on the fields as well as

access to our equipment for inventory and

3 purchasing. With the village eliminating our

access to the concession stand and our loss of

use, we are already behind for the upcoming

6 season.

7

With this being time sensitive, I

even asked Glena if she would do a temporary 8

9 emergency extension of our contract until our new

10 contract was finalized. We were presented with a

draft of the new current -- of the new contract at 11

our monthly NLYA board meeting on February 13th, 12

13 by Glena. Glena also set a date for February 22nd

to meet to sign the contract. 14

15 No questions were asked of us by the 16 three village affiliates, Mayor Arriola, Council 17 Member Sands or Municipal Manager Madden. As a 18 board we reviewed the proposed contract and feel

19 the contract is unreasonable for the following

20 reasons: Annual rent increase from \$1 per year to

21 \$500 per year. That's a 500 percent increase.

22 The NLYA has expenses that we take

23 care of for the village that other organizations

don't pay for. We made a spreadsheet and I have 24

25 copies of everything for you guys. We made a

35 1 spreadsheet showing that in the past four years

we've invested over \$48,000 just in the fields and

facilities. That's just in the fields and the

actual building itself that we use at Don Rusk 4

5 There are many other expenses that go into

the program. We are just identifying those 6

7 directly related to maintaining the facilities we

8 use.
